EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 101

Series of 2026

AN ORDER DECLARING THE SUSPENSION OF CLASSES IN ALL LEVELS IN BOTH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF BAYAMBANG, PANGASINAN ON JULY 10, 2026, DUE TO THE THREAT OF TYPHOON "INDAY" (INTERNATIONAL NAME: BAVI) AND THE ENHANCED SOUTHWEST MONSOON, DIRECTING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF LEARNING CONTINUITY PLANS, AND PROVIDING FOR PREVENTIVE MEASURES RELEVANT THERETO

WHEREAS, Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, explicitly mandates local government units to exercise the powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare, health, and safety of their constituents;

WHEREAS, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) has issued its latest Weather Bulletin indicating that Typhoon "INDAY" (BAVI) combined with the enhanced Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) may bring continuous heavy-to-intense rainfall, strong winds, and potential flooding within the Province of Pangasinan;

WHEREAS, based on the forecasted extreme weather conditions brought about by Typhoon "INDAY" and the enhanced Southwest Monsoon, it has been recommended that classes at all levels be suspended on Friday, July 10, 2026, as a proactive measure to ensure the safety and welfare of students, teachers, and school personnel from the possible adverse effects of the weather disturbance;

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Bayambang, being highly susceptible to riverine flooding and localized inundation, prioritizes proactive risk reduction and preventive safety actions to shield students, faculty, and academic personnel from hazards associated with severe weather conditions;

WHEREAS, the Department of Education (DepEd) has instituted updated operational protocols via DepEd Order No. 14, s. 2026, detailing standard parameters for learning continuity instructions before, during, and after localized or systemic emergency closures;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARY CLARE JUDITH PHYLLIS JOSE-QUIAMBAO, Municipal Mayor of Bayambang, Pangasinan, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF CLASSES. Classes in all levels, spanning both public and private educational institutions within the territorial jurisdiction of the Municipality of Bayambang, are hereby **SUSPENDED** tomorrow, July 10, 2026.

SECTION 2. LEARNING CONTINUITY FOR PUBLIC BASIC EDUCATION AND ALS. All public elementary and secondary schools, DepEd-operated Community Learning Centers (CLCs), and DepEd-recognized Alternative Learning System (ALS) Providers are hereby reminded and directed to adopt learning continuity instructions consistent with *DepEd Order No. 14, s. 2026*. Academic deliverables shall transition to modular distance learning, asynchronous online platforms, or pre-assigned home-based activities to ensure that learning milestones are preserved without compromising safety.

SECTION 3. ADOPTION BY PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS AND SUCs/LUCs. Private elementary and secondary schools, private ALS providers, and basic education units of State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) and Local Universities and Colleges (LUCs) operating within Bayambang are highly encouraged and authorized to likewise adopt the alternative learning guidelines provided under *DepEd Order No. 14, s. 2026*, adapting the mechanisms to their respective institutional structures.

SECTION 4. DISASTER MONITORING AND PREPAREDNESS. The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO), together with the Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Committees (BDRRMCs), shall maintain a 24/7 heightened alert status. School administrators are advised to secure campus facilities, equipment, and learning materials against potential wind or water damage.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any provision of this Order is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions not affected thereby shall continue to remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. REPEALING CLAUSE. All prior executive issuances, rules, or regulations inconsistent herewith are modified or repealed accordingly.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain valid for the duration of the specified calendar day or until otherwise lifted or amended.
